Summary Information

Overview. The bill requires large utilities to create communication plans to notify customers about residential advanced metering infrastructure.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires investor-owned electric utilities serving more than 500,000 customers to submit customer communication plans to the Public Utilities Commission by December 31, 2025, outlining how they will inform residential customers about the use of advanced metering infrastructure. Utilities must make efforts to notify customers before installation and maintain a phone line and website with details on opting out. Additionally, utilities must ensure advanced metering infrastructure complies with federal radio frequency standards.

State Expenditures

The bill minimally increases workload in the PUC to review submitted communication plans from utilities. This work can be accommodated during the normal course of business and no change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 20, 2025, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
