UP A NEW ARMORED BRIGADE COMBAT TEAM BY TRANSITIONING
AN INFANTRY BRIGADE COMBAT TEAM STATIONED AT FORT
CARSON INTO AN ARMORED BRIGADE COMBAT TEAM TO BE
STATIONED AT FORT CARSON.
WHEREAS, The United States Army must be ready at all times to
respond to global crisis, both with regard to near-peer nations such as
Russia and to rogue regimes that harbor terrorism; and
WHEREAS, As part of fulfilling its mission, in fiscal year 2019,
the United States Army plans to increase its active Armored Brigade
Combat Team (ABCT) capacity by one brigade, from fifteen to sixteen
brigades in total, and further plans to station this new ABCT at an
existing Army installation in the continental U.S.; and
WHEREAS, A Programmatic Environmental Assessment
conducted by the Army considered and analyzed five alternatives for the
creation of the new ABCT, including an option that would convert the

1 2	Division, at Fort Carson, into the 16th ABCT to be stationed at Fort Carson; and
3	WHEREAS, Converting the existing unit at Fort Carson from an
4	IBCT to an ABCT and stationing that ABCT at Fort Carson is the most
5	cost-effective and responsible way to stand up the new unit; Fort Carson
6	would not require new construction or significant renovation to house the
7	ABCT, as the facilities already boast the infrastructure required for
8	sustaining the unit; Fort Carson's training sites are unrivaled; and, because
9	the Army conducted an Environmental Impact Statement on the
10	installation in 2015, there would be no need for an additional costly
11	assessment; and
12	WHEREAS, Community support in the state of Colorado for Fort
13	Carson and its mission, personnel, and families is unmatched; Fort Carson
14	is consistently among the top requested posts for Army families and
15	personnel; and Colorado remains one of the most desirable places to train,
16	work, live, and retire in the nation; and
17	WHEREAS, Fort Carson and the state of Colorado stand proud
18	and prepared to continue to serve the nation to our fullest capability; now,
19	therefore,
20	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly
21	of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
22	That we, the General Assembly of the State of Colorado, along
23	with Colorado's governor and its entire, bipartisan Congressional
24	delegation, strongly urge the Secretary of the Army to stand up the
25	Army's 16th Armored Brigade Combat Team at Fort Carson through the
26	conversion of an Infantry Brigade Combat Team to an Armored Brigade
27	Combat Team to be stationed at Fort Carson.

29	to Governor John Hickenlooper; General Mark A. Milley, Chief of Staff
30	of the Army; Mark Esper, Secretary of the Army; General Lori J.

34	Colorado's Congressional delegation.
