Bill Summary

Committee on Cost-benefit Analysis of Legalized Marijuana in Colorado. The bill directs the department of education:

By July 1, 2017, to create and maintain a resource bank for public schools to use without charge that consists of materials and curricula pertaining to marijuana use; and

9	MARIJUANA, WHICH MATERIALS AND CURRICULA MAY BE USED IN
10	ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THE STATE.
11	CREATING THE RESOURCE BANK AND CURRICULA, THE DEPARTMENT, WITH
12	THE MARIJUANA EDUCATIONAL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED
13	PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-20-112 (4), SHALL SOLICIT INPUT FROM PERSONS
