**Overview.** The bill requires schools to acquire and place AEDs at athletic events.

## **Summary of Legislation**

The bill requires that both public and non-public high schools place an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) at athletic venues. For the 2026-27 school year, this requirement applies to athletic venues owned and operated by the school; for the 2027-28 school year and onward, this requirement applies to all athletic venues, including those not owned by the school.

Additionally, current law requires any entity that acquires an AED to create written plans detailing its placement, use, and maintenance. The bill removes the requirements that these plans specify the personnel authorized to use the AED and be reviewed and approved by a licensed physician.

## **School District**

Beginning in FY 2026-27, local education providers will have increased costs and workload to place AEDs at athletic venues. An AED costs between \$900 and \$2,400, not including maintenance or staff training.

## **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
