### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT FOR EQUITABLE ALLOCATION OF THE
102 COSTS OF DEFENDING A CONSTRUCTION DEFECT CLAIM.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. In a construction defect action in which more than one insurer has a duty to defend a party, the bill requires the court to apportion the costs of defense, including reasonable attorney fees, among all insurers with a duty to defend. An initial order apportioning costs must be made within 90 days after an insurer files its claim for contribution, and the court must make a final apportionment of costs after entry of a final judgment

resolving all of the underlying claims against the insured. An insurer seeking contribution may also make a claim against an insured or additional insured who chose not to procure liability insurance for a period of time relevant to the underlying action. A claim for contribution may be assigned and does not affect any insurer's duty to defend.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 13-20-808, amend 3 (6) introductory portion and (7)(b) as follows: 4 13-20-808. Insurance policies issued to construction 5 professionals. (6) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SECTION 6 13-21-111.5 (6), if an insurer disclaims or limits coverage under a liability 7 insurance policy issued to a construction professional, the insurer shall 8 bear BEARS the burden of proving by a preponderance of the evidence 9 that: 10 (7) (b) When an insurer defends an insured or additional 11 INSURED UNDER A LIABILITY INSURANCE POLICY: 12 (I) An insurer shall defend a construction professional who has 13 received a notice of claim made pursuant to section 13-20-803.5 14 regardless of whether another insurer may also owe the insured a duty to 15 defend the notice of claim unless authorized by law. In defending the 16 claim, the insurer shall: 17 (A) Reasonably investigate the claim; and 18 (B) Reasonably cooperate with the insured in the notice of claims 19 process The defending insurer has a claim for contribution 20 TOWARD THE COST OF THE DEFENSE, INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY 21 FEES, AGAINST ALL OTHER INSURERS WHO ALSO OWE THE INSURED OR 22 ADDITIONAL INSURED A DUTY TO DEFEND. 23 (II) This paragraph (b) does not require the insurer to retain legal

2 of claim that are not covered by the insurance policy THE INSURERS WITH 3 A DUTY TO DEFEND MAY, AMONG THEMSELVES, AGREE ON HOW TO 4 APPORTION PAST AND FUTURE DEFENSE COSTS, INCLUDING REASONABLE 5 ATTORNEY FEES. ANY SUCH AGREEMENT IS ENFORCEABLE AS A CONTRACT. 6 IF THE INSURERS ARE UNABLE TO REACH SUCH AN AGREEMENT WITHIN 7 FORTY-FIVE DAYS AFTER THE FILING OF THE CONTRIBUTION ACTION, THE 8 DISTRICT COURT SHALL SET THE CONTRIBUTION CLAIM FOR AN EXPEDITED 9 EVIDENTIARY HEARING, WHICH MUST BE HELD WITHIN SIXTY DAYS. 10 STATEMENTS MADE BY PARTIES AND COUNSEL ON BEHALF OF ANY PARTY, 11 WHEN OFFERED TO PROVE LIABILITY FOR, VALIDITY OF, OR AMOUNT OF 12 ANY CLAIMS DURING THE HEARING, ARE NOT ADMISSIBLE IN ANY 13 SUBSEQUENT PROCEEDING. THE DISTRICT COURT SHALL PROMPTLY DECIDE 14 THE CLAIM UNLESS ALL THE PARTIES TO THE CLAIM AGREE TO RESOLVE IT 15 THROUGH A MUTUALLY ACCEPTABLE, ALTERNATIVE PROCESS. THE 16 DISTRICT COURT SHALL ENTER SUCH ORDERS AS ARE NECESSARY TO HOLD 17 THE EXPEDITED EVIDENTIARY HEARING, INCLUDING ESTABLISHING AN 18 EXPEDITED BRIEFING SCHEDULE AND PRECLUDING DISCOVERY. 19 (III) An insurer shall not withdraw its defense of an insured 20 construction professional or commence an action seeking reimbursement 21 from an insured for expended defense cost unless authorized by law and 22 unless the insurer has reserved such right in writing when accepting or 23 assuming the defense obligation THE DISTRICT COURT SHALL, ON AN 24 INTERIM BASIS PENDING CONCLUSION OF THE UNDERLYING ACTION 25 AGAINST THE INSURED, APPORTION PAST AND FUTURE DEFENSE COSTS, 26 INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY FEES, AMONG ALL INSURERS AS IS 27 EQUITABLE UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES.

1	(IV) AFTER A JUDGMENT RESOLVING ALL CLAIMS IN THE
2	UNDERLYING ACTION AGAINST THE INSURED BECOMES FINAL, ANY
3	INSURER MAY APPLY TO THE DISTRICT COURT FOR A FINAL
4	APPORTIONMENT OF THE DEFENSE COSTS, INCLUDING REASONABLE
5	ATTORNEY FEES, ACTUALLY PAID BY ALL INSURERS PURSUANT TO THE
6	INITIAL ORDERS ARISING FROM THE CONTRIBUTION ACTION. IN RENDERING

15	THE INSURERS THAT THE COURT DEEMS RELEVANT.
16	(V) ANY INSURER SEEKING CONTRIBUTION MAY INCLUDE A CLAIM
17	AGAINST AN INSURED OR ADDITIONAL INSURED WHO CHOSE NOT TO
18	PROCURE LIABILITY INSURANCE FOR ANY PERIOD OF TIME IMPLICATED BY
19	THE UNDERLING ACTION AND THE ALLEGATIONS THEREIN.
20	(VI) THE CONTRIBUTION CLAIM MAY BE ASSIGNED.
21	(VII) THE CONTRIBUTION CLAIM DOES NOT LIMIT ANY INSURER'S
22	DUTY TO DEFEND.
23	SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
24	July 1, 2017, and applies to actions filed on or after said date.
25	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
26	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
27	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
