# **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$106,995 General Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2019-20. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.7 FTE.

#### L.003 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment L.003 (attached) includes the following changes to the bill:

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- Clarifies that the grants under the pilot program are subject to available appropriations.
- Reduces the number of pilot schools from thirty in the introduced bill to fifteen in amendment L.003.
- Specifies that the General Assembly shall appropriate \$1,100,000 cash funds from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund to the Department of Education to implement the pilot program in FY 2019-20 and makes that money available to the Department (without further appropriation) through FY 2023-24.
- Adds this pilot program as a specifically authorized use of the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund.

Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$1,100,000 cash funds from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2019-20. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.7 FTE.

If the Committee adopts amendment L.003 then it <u>should</u> adopt amendment J.002 and should <u>not</u> adopt amendment J.001.

## **Points to Consider**

# General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2019-20 based on the March 2019 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package leaves approximately \$47.9 million General Fund unallocated. Thus, the General Assembly could appropriate up to \$44.7 million General Fund to fund 2019 legislation and maintain a 7.25 percent General Fund reserve. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$106,995 for FY 2019-20, reducing the excess General Fund reserve by \$114,752.

## Future Fiscal Impact

In addition to the General Fund impact in FY 2019-20, this bill is projected to require General Fund appropriations of \$3,013,373 per year for FY 2020-21 through FY 2022-23.

# Revenue Source/Related Budget Information

With sponsor amendment L.003, this bill requires an appropriation of \$1.1 million cash funds from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2019-20. A total of \$158.9 million is projected to be available in the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund for appropriation in FY 2019-20, based on the March 2019 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. As detailed below, the FY 2019-20 budget package introduced by the Joint Budget Committee, as amended by General Assembly action on the Long Bill, leaves \$28.1 million available.
