A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CONTINUATION OF THE SCHOOL ACCESS FOR 102 EMERGENCY RESPONSE GRANT PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The school access for emergency response (SAFER) grant program is scheduled to repeal on July 1, 2024. The bill extends the SAFER grant program for 5 years, until July 1, 2029, and clarifies when the state treasurer is required to transfer unexpended money from the SAFER grant program's cash fund when the grant program is repealed.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 24-33.5-2108
3	as follows:
4	24-33.5-2108. Repeal of part. This part 21 is repealed, effective
5	July 1, 2024. 2029.
6	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-2107,
7	amend (1)(b) and (4) as follows:
8	24-33.5-2107. School access for emergency response grant
9	program cash fund. (1) (b) On July 1, 2018, and each July 1 thereafter
10	through July 1, 2023 2028, the state treasurer shall transfer five million
11	dollars to the fund from the state public school fund created in section
12	<u>22-54-114.</u>
13	(4) The state treasurer shall transfer all unexpended and
14	unencumbered money in the fund to the general fund after the grant
15	program repeals pursuant to section 24-33.5-2108 ON JUNE 30, 2029.
16	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
17	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
18	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
