8	SECTION 2. In Session Laws of Colorado 2022, section 56 of

10	Section 56. Appropriation. (13) ANY MONEY APPROPRIATED IN
11	SUBSECTION (5)(f) OF THIS SECTION NOT EXPENDED PRIOR TO JULY 1,
12	2023, is further appropriated to the department of public health
13	AND ENVIRONMENT FOR USE BY THE PREVENTION SERVICES DIVISION FOR
14	The $2023-24$ and $2024-25$ state fiscal years for the same purpose.
15	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
16	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
