8	WHEREAS, Commissioner Gaiter married his wife, Jeannette, on

3 4 5 6	WHEREAS, During his career as a software engineer, Commissioner Gaiter worked for companies, including Spectralogic, Hewlett-Packard, United Airlines, and Colorado State University and ran his own business, StarFire Enterprises; and
7 8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, A longtime resident of Larimer County, Commissioner Gaiter was first appointed as the Larimer County Commissioner representing District 1 in a vacancy election in January 2010 and was elected to the same position in November 2010 and reelected in November 2014, going on to serve for eight years; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS, As a dedicated public servant, Commissioner Gaiter served as chair of the Larimer County Board of Commissioners and president of Colorado Counties, Inc., among many other roles; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, Commissioner Gaiter was credited with promoting rural broadband access, helping to develop a five-year strategic plan, and supporting economic development work; and
18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, Commissioner Gaiter was an active member of the Loveland Volunteer Ski Patrol for twenty-five years and a passionate Denver Broncos fan and participated in the boards of various nonprofit organizations, including Christian Home Educators of Colorado and Realities for Children; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS, After a long battle with a rare blood cancer, Commissioner Gaiter passed away peacefully on September 18, 2018, with his wife, Jeannette, and other family members by his side; and
26 27 28	WHEREAS, Commissioner Gaiter is remembered as "a man of great dedication to his work, strong faith, integrity, and courage"; now, therefore,
