Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill contains an appropriations clause that reduces the General Fund appropriation in two departments by a total of \$89,398 and 0.5 FTE. The appropriation was reduced by \$86,567 and 0.5 FTE for chronic disease and cancer prevention grants within the Prevention Services Division in the Department of Public Health and Environment, and reduced by \$2,831 for the General Assembly within the Legislative Department.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a budget package for FY 2025-26 based on the March 2025 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. As part of the package, the JBC has included a reduction of \$86,567 General Fund appropriations for the Department of Public Health and Environment to be included in this bill. The additional reduction of \$2,831 General Fund for the Legislative Department was not included in the FY 2025-26 budget package and allows \$2,831 General Fund to be made available for other purposes.
