A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE KIDNEY DISEASE PREVENTION
102	AND EDUCATION TASK FORCE, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH
103	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill creates the kidney disease prevention and education task force (task force) in the department of public health and environment (department). The task force consists of members that are part of the general assembly and members that are not part of the general assembly. The task force's purpose is to evaluate and make recommendations to the

general assembly about the detection, treatment, education, and awareness of kidney disease in Colorado.

The task force has the following duties:

- To work with various entities to create kidney disease educational programs and increase overall awareness of kidney disease in Colorado;
- To examine chronic kidney disease, transplantation, donation, and the higher rates of affliction in minority populations; and
- To develop a plan to raise awareness about kidney disease in Colorado, which shall include an ongoing campaign that incorporates health workshops, preventative screenings, social media campaigns, and television and radio commercials.

The task force is required to submit an initial report with its findings and recommendations to the general assembly by December 1, 2023. The task force is required to convene by November 1, 2021, and is required to meet at least 4 times every year. Following the task force's submittal of the initial report, the task force shall elect a chair and vice-chair from the members who are not part of the general assembly, and the members who are part of the general assembly shall transition to an advisory role. The task force is required to submit follow-up reports each year.

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly hereby finds and declares that:

- (a) The kidneys are vital organs that clean the blood, help control blood pressure, make red blood cells, and keep bones healthy;
 - (b) Approximately 37 million Americans currently suffer from kidney disease and millions more are at risk for developing kidney disease in the future;
- (c) Black Americans are about 4 times more likely and Hispanic Americans are about 1.6 times more likely than white Americans to suffer from kidney failure;
- (d) In 2017, there were 1,138 new cases of kidney failure

1	diagnosed in Colorado, and of those new cases, only 68 were able to
2	receive a transplant;
3	(e) In 2019, only an estimated 1 in 4 Coloradans on the waiting
4	list for a kidney transplant were able to receive a transplant;
5	(f) The main causes of chronic kidney disease are diabetes and
6	high blood pressure, and an estimated 7% of Coloradans suffer from
7	diabetes and an estimated 25.9% of Coloradans have high blood pressure;
8	(g) According to the Centers for Disease Control, 96% of people
9	with early kidney disease are unaware that they are afflicted because there
10	are typically no symptoms until the later stages of the disease; and
11	(h) If kidney disease is detected early through blood and urine
12	tests, it is often possible to slow or stop its progress through treatment.
13	(2) The general assembly further finds and declares that, in light
14	of the detrimental effects of kidney disease on the population of Colorado
15	and the United States, it is in the interest of the state and of local
16	communities to convene a task force to study and make recommendations
17	on the prevention, treatment, disparity of impact, and overall awareness
18	of kidney disease in Colorado.
19	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25-1-131 as

- (3) ALL APPOINTMENTS TO THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE MADE NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 1, 2021. THE TERMS OF THE ELECTED MEMBERS TERMINATE ON THE CONVENING DATE OF THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY. AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE AFTER SUCH CONVENING DATE, BUT NO LATER THAN THE END OF THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION, THE SPEAKER AND MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE PRESIDENT AND THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE SHALL EACH APPOINT OR REAPPOINT THE ELECTED MEMBERS. THEREAFTER, THE TERMS OF THE ELECTED MEMBERS EXPIRE ON THE CONVENING DATE OF THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF EACH GENERAL ASSEMBLY, AND ALL SUBSEQUENT APPOINTMENTS AND REAPPOINTMENTS OF THE ELECTED MEMBERS MUST BE MADE AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE AFTER THE CONVENING DATE, BUT NO LATER THAN THE END OF THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION. THE DURATION OF THE APPOINTMENTS OF THE NONELECTED MEMBERS ARE FOR THE DURATION OF THE TASK FORCE.
- (4) THE PERSON MAKING THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT OR REAPPOINTMENT TO THE TASK FORCE SHALL FILL ANY VACANCY BY APPOINTMENT FOR THE REMAINDER OF AN UNEXPIRED TERM. MEMBERS APPOINTED OR REAPPOINTED SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY AND CONTINUE TO SERVE UNTIL THE MEMBER'S SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.
- (5) NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 2-2-326, EACH MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE SERVES WITHOUT COMPENSATION, AND A MEMBER IS NOT

3	(6) THE INITIAL CO-CHAIRS SHALL CONVENE THE FIRST MEETING

16	(b) TO EXAMINE CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE, TRANSPLANTATION,
17	LIVING AND DECEASED KIDNEY DONATION, AND THE HIGHER RATES OF
18	AFFLICTION IN MINORITY POPULATIONS; AND
19	(c) TO DEVELOP A SUSTAINABLE PLAN TO RAISE AWARENESS
20	ABOUT EARLY DETECTION OF KIDNEY DISEASE AND TO PROMOTE HEALTH
21	EQUITY, TRANSPLANTATION, AND TO REDUCE THE BURDEN OF KIDNEY
22	DISEASE THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF COLORADO, WHICH SHALL INCLUDE
23	AN ONGOING CAMPAIGN THAT INCORPORATES:
24	(I) HEALTH EDUCATION WORKSHOPS AND SEMINARS;
25	(II) PREVENTATIVE SCREENINGS;
26	(III) SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGNS; AND

1	(8) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT
2	TO THE TASK FORCE AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
3	THE DEPARTMENT MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS, GRANTS, OR
4	DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS
5	SECTION.
6	(9) On or before December 1, 2023, the task force shall
7	SUBMIT ITS INITIAL REPORT, INCLUDING ITS FINDINGS AND
8	RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE ISSUES IDENTIFIED IN SUBSECTION (7) OF THIS
9	SECTION, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY. NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION
10	24-1-136 (11), THE TASK FORCE SHALL SUBMIT FOLLOW-UP REPORTS
11	ISSUED EACH YEAR.
12	(10) FOLLOWING THE SUBMITTAL OF THE INITIAL REPORT
13	DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (9) OF THIS SECTION, THE NONELECTED
14	MEMBERS SHALL SELECT A NEW CHAIR AND A NEW VICE-CHAIR FROM
15	AMONG THE NONELECTED MEMBERS. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON THE
16	SELECTION OF THE NEW CHAIR AND NEW VICE-CHAIR:
17	(a) THE INITIAL CO-CHAIRS NO LONGER SERVE AS CHAIR AND
18	VICE-CHAIR; AND
19	(b) The elected members are no longer voting members
20	AND SERVE ON THE TASK FORCE SOLELY IN AN ADVISORY CAPACITY.

8	\$71,529 is appropriated to the department of public health and

11	the division will require an additional 1.0 FTE. To implement this act, the
12	division may use this appropriation for the kidney disease task force
13	related to chronic disease prevention programs.
14	SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
15	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
