Fiscal note status: The revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill, as amended by the House Energy and Environment Committee. The bill was recommended by the Representative Hugh McKean Colorado Youth Advisory Council Review Committee.

Summary Information

Overview. The bill adds youth members to the Environmental Justice Advisory Board and requires the Colorado Energy Office to develop best practices for clean energy in schools.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

- State Expenditures

Appropriations. For FY 2025-26, the bill requires an appropriation of \$5,042 to the Department of Public Health and Environment. See Technical Note.

Summary of Legislation

The bill adds one voting and one nonvoting youth member to the Environmental Justice Advisory Board in the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE). The Governor's Office must appoint the youth members by September 15, 2025.

The bill also requires the Colorado Energy Office (CEO) to develop best practices for adopting and financing clean energy resources in schools by December 31, 2025. This information must be posted and kept updated on the CEO website.

State Expenditures

The bill increases state expenditures from the Community Impact Cash Fund (CICF) in the CDPHE by approximately \$5,000 beginning in FY 2025-26. The bill also increases workload in the CEO and the Governor's Office.

Department of Public Health and Environment

CDPHE requires \$5,042 annually to add two new members to the Environmental Justice Advisory Board. This estimate is based on the costs required for current members to attend the quarterly board meetings and includes all travel, lodging, and stipend costs.

Colorado Energy Office

Workload will increase for the CEO to develop best practices for the adoption and financing of clean energy resources in schools, and to update the resource periodically. This is expected to take less than 100 hours of staff time initially, and can be accomplished within existing resources.

Governor's Office

Workload will minimally increase for the Governor's Office to appoint two youth members to the board.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.

Technical Note

[Senate Bill 25-265](#) would make the CICF subject to annual appropriation. The fiscal note highlights an appropriation in this bill in the case that SB 25-265 becomes law. If SB 25-265 does not become law, these costs do not require an appropriation, as the fund will maintain continuous spending authority.

State Appropriations

For FY 2025-26, the bill requires an appropriation of \$5,042 from the Community Impact Cash Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment.
