

SENATE BILL 21-144

CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE HOMELAND SECURITY AND ALL-HAZARDS SENIOR ADVISORY COMMITTEE, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE 2020 SUNSET REPORT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-1614, **amend** (4)(a) as follows:

24-33.5-1614. Homeland security and all-hazards senior advisory committee - composition - duties - emergency planning subcommittee - public safety communications subcommittee - creation - definitions. (4) (a) This section is repealed, effective September 1, 2021. SEPTEMBER 1, 2031.

Capital letters or bold & italic numbers indicate new material added to existing law; dashes through words or numbers indicate deletions from existing law and such material is not part of the act.

- **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, **add** (21); and **repeal** (12)(a)(I) as follows:
- **2-3-1203.** Sunset review of advisory committees legislative declaration definition repeal. (12) (a) The following statutory authorizations for the designated advisory committees will repeal on September 1, 2021:
- (I) The homeland security and all-hazards senior advisory committee created in section 24-33.5-1614, C.R.S.;
- (21) (a) The following statutory authorizations for the designated advisory committees will repeal on September 1, 2031:
- (I) THE HOMELAND SECURITY AND ALL-HAZARDS SENIOR ADVISORY COMMITTEE CREATED IN SECTION 24-33.5-1614.
- (b) This subsection (21) is repealed, effective September 1, 2033.
- **SECTION 3.** Effective date. This act takes effect September 1, 2021.
