### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.002** Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$423,448 General Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2021-22, based

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on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 3.7 FTE. Of that amount, \$53,170 is reappropriated to the Department of Law, based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE.

### **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$48.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$423,448 for FY 2021-22, reducing the \$48.0 million set aside by the same amount.

Section 40-2-110 (1), C.R.S. specifies that the programs administered by the Public Utilities Commission be funded from the Fixed Utility Fund. However, as noted in the Technical Note on page 4 of the Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note, there are not sufficient resources in the Fixed Utility Fund at the present time to support the expenditures identified in the fiscal note. If the General Assembly revises the statutory maximum fee, these and future expenses may be paid from the Fixed Utility Fund.
