Bill Summary

The bill recreates the former health care task force, renamed as the statewide health care review committee, to study health care issues that affect Colorado residents throughout the state. The committee consists of

26	LEGISLATIVE INTERIM, UNLESS ADDITIONAL MEETINGS ARE AUTHORIZED

4	SECTION 2. Appropriation. (1) For the 2019-20 state fiscal
5	year, \$13,847 is appropriated to the legislative department. This
6	appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the
7	department may use this appropriation as follows:
8	(a) \$9,607 for use by the legislative council, which amount is
9	based on an assumption that the council will require an additional 0.1
10	FTE; and
11	(b) \$4,240 for use by the general assembly.
12	SECTION <u>3.</u> Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
13	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
14	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
