Fiscal note status: The final fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill. The bill was deemed lost in the House of Representatives on May 8, 2025; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary Information

Overview. The bill would have required local education providers to adopt policies that provide options for youth service organizations to present to students.

Types of impacts. The bill was projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires each institute charter school, district charter school, and local board of education to adopt a policy that provides options for youth service organizations to communicate to students about available opportunities outside of instructional time. The bill outlines what schools may consider in their policies, and allows school leaders or district leaders to determine the time, place, and manner of an organization's presentation on school campuses during the school day. Schools must adopt the policy by January 1, 2026, and post it on their website by the start of the 2026-27 academic year.

School District

Workload will increase for schools to develop the policy, establish internal processes for youth organization presentations, and ensure the policy posted to its website. This workload increase is expected to be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
