### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill allows the Attorney General to require a cable provider and regional sports network to submit to nonbinding arbitration when a dispute over the renewal of a contract to broadcast professional sporting events involving Colorado's professional sports teams continues for at least six weeks after the contract has expired.

## **State Expenditures**

The bill minimally increases workload in the Department of Law, should the Attorney General decide to require the parties to submit to nonbinding arbitration. No change in appropriations is required.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Business Affairs and Labor Committee on April 27, 2022.
