101 CONCERNING ELECTRONIC PARTICIPATION IN COMMITTEE MEETINGS 102 DURING THE LEGISLATIVE INTERIM.

Bill Summary

The bill gives the executive committee of the legislative council the ability to consider, recommend, and establish policies regarding electronic participation by senators or representatives in committee meetings during the legislative interim. SENATE rd Reading Unamended

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
3	hereby finds and declares that:
4	(a) Electronic participation in committee meetings by members of
5	the general assembly is currently prohibited, but that general prohibition
6	fails to account for technological advances or the reality that Colorado's
7	part-time legislature presents significant year-round demands on members
8	fulfilling various legislative obligations;
9	(b) Modern technology facilitates a verisimilitude of in-person
10	interaction, which technology Colorado has already successfully deployed
11	to permit remote testimony by the public at committee meetings;
12	(c) Rather than enshrine in black-letter law exhaustive criteria to
13	govern and circumscribe the use of electronic participation, the general
14	assembly entrusts the executive committee of the legislative council to
15	monitor members' electronic participation, if any is allowed, and to
16	develop and occasionally revisit policies so as to:
17	(I) Attain the equitable, secure, and orderly use of electronic
18	participation, including whether it is feasible and desirable to allow
19	electronically participating members to vote on matters before the
20	committee or whether such members shall be counted for attendance
21	purposes but prohibited from voting; and
22	(II) Ensure the access to, and quality of, legislative proceedings
23	for the public, especially inasmuch as the proceedings may incorporate
24	visual technology that allows electronically participating members to see
25	and be seen; and
26	(d) The general assembly therefore intends to enable the executive
27	committee of the legislative council to allow, in its discretion, electronic

2	legislators in a manner that provides maximum flexibility for current and
3	future legislative leaders to implement, regulate, and refine the
4	parameters governing electronic participation.
5	(2) The general assembly further finds that a legislator
6	participating electronically is still entitled to compensation for attending
7	the meeting, but not for reimbursement of expenses.
8	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-303, add (2)(h)
9	as follows:
10	2-3-303. Functions - report - definitions. (2) In addition to any
11	other powers and duties set forth in law, the executive committee of the
12	legislative council has the following powers and duties:
13	(h) (I) The power to allow members of the general
14	ASSEMBLY TO PARTICIPATE ELECTRONICALLY IN COMMITTEE MEETINGS
15	AND TO RECOMMEND AND DEVELOP POLICIES REGARDING ELECTRONIC
16	PARTICIPATION IF SO ALLOWED; EXCEPT THAT, IF ALLOWED, ELECTRONIC
17	PARTICIPATION MUST ONLY BE ALLOWED FOR COMMITTEE MEETINGS
18	OCCURRING DURING THE LEGISLATIVE INTERIM.

20	(II) A MEMBER PARTICIPATING ELECTRONICALLY IN A COMMITTEE
21	MEETING PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (2)(h) IS DEEMED TO BE IN
22	ATTENDANCE OF THAT COMMITTEE FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECEIVING
23	COMPENSATION TO WHICH THE MEMBER IS ENTITLED UNDER SECTION
24	2-2-307 (3). Notwithstanding section 2-2-307 (3)(b), members
25	PARTICIPATING ELECTRONICALLY ARE NOT ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT
26	FOR ANY EXPENSES INCURRED IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH ELECTRONIC
27	PARTICIPATION.
