### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates \$64,738 General Fund to the Behavioral Health Administration. The clause does not correctly reference that the Behavioral Health Administration is within the Department of Human Services.

## **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.002** Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to make technical corrections to the existing appropriations clause to indicate that the appropriation is to the Behavioral Health Administration within the Department of Human Services.

### **Points to Consider**

#### General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$64,738 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.
