Summary of Legislation

Under current law, bullying behaviors are subject to public school discipline policies and reporting requirements. This bill adds a pattern of bullying based on weight, height, or body size to prohibited bullying behaviors.

State Expenditures

The Colorado Department of Education and the Department of Early Childhood will have an increase in workload in FY 2024-25 only to update rules and definitions. This additional workload is minimal and no new appropriation is required.

School District

School districts will update their rules to reflect the new definition. The workload to implement the bill is assumed to be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
