3	WHEREAS, According to Section 15 of the "Federal Noxious
4	Weed Act", P.L. 93-629 (the Act), each federal agency has a duty to
5	designate an office or person adequately trained in the management of
6	undesirable plant species to establish, develop, coordinate, and adequately
7 8	fund an undesirable plants management program for control of undesirable plants on federal lands under the agency's jurisdiction; and
9	WHEREAS, The Act describes the management process to control
10	undesirable plants, the "cooperative agreement" with state entities, and
l 1	"authorized appropriations" for budgeting; and
12	WHEREAS, Local farmers whose land is adjacent to the refuges
13	are seeing their properties harmed by invasive noxious weeds that have
14	spread from the refuge lands; and
15	WHEREAS, Local farmers must either pay for their own noxious
16	weed control or incur a charge when the local weed control districts treat
17	the noxious weeds on their lands; now, therefore,
18	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventieth General Assembly
19	of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
20	That we, the General Assembly:
21	(1) Desire to bring to the attention of the United States
22	Department of the Interior, the Bureau of Land Management, and the
23	United States Fish and Wildlife Service the problem of invasive noxious
24	weeds spreading throughout and beyond the aforementioned refuges;
25	(2) Request that the federal agencies allow a request-for-proposal
26	contract between the NWR and a licensed commercial applicator weed
27	control subcontractor in order to resolve the matter;
28	(3) Suggest that the federal government provide appropriate
29	funding to adequately control the current amount of noxious weeds; and
30	(4) Establish adequate funding for future noxious weed control.
