After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

HB24-1305 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

- Amend printed bill, page 3, line 4, strike "industry" and substitute 1
- 2 "industry, INCLUDING THE MAJOR INDUSTRY CATEGORIES IDENTIFIED IN
- THE COLORADO TALENT REPORT PRODUCED PURSUANT TO SECTION
- 4 24-46.3-103 (3), WHICH INCLUDES LIFE, PHYSICAL, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES;
- 5 ARCHITECTURE AND ENGINEERING; COMPUTERS AND MATHEMATICS;
- 6 INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE, AND REPAIR; BUSINESS AND FINANCE;
- 7 CONSTRUCTION AND EXTRACTION; COMMUNITY AND SOCIAL SERVICES;
- 8 AND TRANSPORTATION AND MATERIAL MOVING OCCUPATIONS,".
- 9 Page 3, line 17, before "as" insert "and (5)(f)".
- 10 Page 4, strike lines 4 through 8 and substitute:

''(f)

- 11 Notwithstanding the lifetime-credit-hour limitation
- 12 established pursuant to paragraph (c) of this subsection (5) SUBSECTION
- 13 (5)(c) OF THIS SECTION and in addition to the provisions of paragraph (e) 14
- of this subsection (5) SUBSECTION (5)(e) OF THIS SECTION, a state
- 15 institution of higher education may annually grant a one-year waiver of
- 16 the lifetime-credit-hour limitation for up to five percent of the eligible
- 17 undergraduate students enrolled in the state institution of higher
- 18 education. In granting the waivers under this paragraph (f), the state
- 19 institution of higher education shall, upon request, grant a waiver to an
- 20 eligible undergraduate student for courses taken pursuant to the
- "Concurrent Enrollment Programs Act", article 35 of title 22, C.R.S., or 21
- 22 for courses taken while enrolled in a pathways in technology early college
- 23 high school pursuant to article 35.3 of title 22. C.R.S. For any remaining
- 24 portion of the institution's five percent of eligible undergraduate students
- 25 who may receive waivers, the institution shall give priority to students
- 26 who are seeking job retraining.

SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 1 2 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 4 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 6 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 7 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 8 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.". 9
