If the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid services continues to allow the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to make supplemental payments to the University of Colorado School of Medicine, the Department of Higher Education shall transfer the amount approved, up to \$81,709,561, to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing pursuant to Section 23-18-304(1)(c), C.R.S. If permission is discontinued, or is granted for a lesser amount, the Department of Higher Education shall transfer any portion of the \$81,709,561 that is not transferred to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to the Regents of the University of Colorado.—In addition, it is assumed that the University of Colorado School of Medicine will use clinical revenues to make an intergovernmental transfer in the amount approved, up to \$11,668,599 to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, including up to \$180,000 for actual administrative costs:
