# A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT THAT A COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY CREATED IN COLORADO BEFORE JULY 1, 1992, COMPLY WITH A PROVISION OF THE "COLORADO COMMON INTEREST OWNERSHIP ACT" THAT ALLOWS A MAJORITY OF THE UNIT OWNERS IN A COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY TO VETO A BUDGET PROPOSED BY THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY.

# **Bill Summary**

Common interest communities created before the July 1, 1992, enactment of the "Colorado Common Interest Ownership Act" (Act) are exempt from many of the Act's provisions, including a provision allowing a majority of the unit owners in a common interest community to veto a budget proposed by the common interest community's executive board. The bill requires a common interest community that predates the Act to allow its unit owners to veto, by majority vote, a budget proposed by the common interest community's executive board.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 38-33.3-117, amend 3 (1.8) as follows: 4 38-33.3-117. Applicability to preexisting common interest 5 **communities.** (1.8) Except as provided in section 38-33.3-119, section 6  $38-33.3-303 \frac{(4)(a)(1)}{(4)(a)}$  applies to all common interest communities 7 created within this state before July 1, 1992, with respect to events and 8 circumstances occurring on or after July 1, 2017. 9 **SECTION 2.** Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect 10 July 1, 2018, and applies to proposed budgets adopted by a common 11 interest community's executive board on or after said date. 12 **SECTION 3.** Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, 13 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 14 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
