WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was born September 18, 1928, in Boone, Colorado, to John and Venita Lucero; and

WHEREAS, Representative Lucero graduated from Centennial High School in Pueblo, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, Representative Lucero served our nation as a Sergeant in the Marine Corps; and

WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was a teacher and school administrator for Pueblo School District 60 for many years; and

WHEREAS, In 1970, Representative Lucero ran for and was elected to the Colorado House of Representatives for House District 36; and

WHEREAS, In 1972, Representative Lucero ran for reelection and became the representative for House District 42, which he served until 1984; and

WHEREAS, During his 14 years serving as a member of the House of Representatives, Representative Lucero served on the Agriculture and Livestock; Labor and Employment Relations; Game, Fish, and Parks; and the Legislative Audit Committees and as Chair of the Education Committee; and

WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was preceded in death by his son Larry and is survived by his wife Eleanor, daughters Cindy and Judy, son Gerald, and many grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was a devoted public servant who will be remembered for his hard work, dedication, and accomplishments; now, therefore,
