A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING AUTHORIZATION FOR THE RESTORATION OF THE NORTH

AMERICAN WOLVERINE IN THE STATE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill authorizes the reintroduction of the North American wolverine in the state by the division of parks and wildlife (division). As long as the North American wolverine remains on the list of threatened or endangered species pursuant to applicable federal law, the division shall not reintroduce the North American wolverine in the state until a final rule designating the North American wolverine in Colorado as a

nonessential experimental population pursuant to applicable federal law has taken effect.

The bill also creates certain requirements for the reintroduction of the North American wolverine. The parks and wildlife commission must adopt rules for the compensation of owners of livestock for losses caused by the North American wolverine.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 finds and declares that: 4 (a) The North American wolverine, whose scientific name is *Gulo* 5 gulo luscus, is the largest terrestrial species of weasel in the world; 6 (b) There are approximately three hundred to four hundred North 7 American wolverines in the lower forty-eight states; 8 (c) The North American wolverine was listed in November 2023 9 as threatened pursuant to the federal "Endangered Species Act of 1973", 10 and therefore requires legislative authorization before reintroduction can 11 occur; 12 (d) The North American wolverine requires a high-elevation 13 habitat with persistent, deep snowpack, and Colorado has some of the 14 best remaining unoccupied wolverine habitat in the lower forty-eight 15 states; 16 (e) The North American wolverine eats small animals, carrion, 17 and other native prey, and conflicts with livestock are extremely rare; 18 (f) The North American wolverine is no longer found in Colorado 19 as it was extirpated in the early 1900s; 20 (g) The mission of the division of parks and wildlife includes 21 perpetuating the wildlife resources of the state, and the division of parks 22 and wildlife has the expertise to design, implement, and lead a

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1	science-based North American wolverine reintroduction program in
2	Colorado;
3	(h) The department of natural resources has been working toward
4	restoration of the North American wolverine in Colorado since the
5	division of parks and wildlife first published a "Draft Strategy for the
6	Conservation and Reestablishment of Lynx and Wolverine in the
7	Southern Rocky Mountains" in 1998;
8	(i) Colorado's alpine habitats can accommodate as many as one
9	hundred to one hundred eighty wolverines, which would substantially
10	contribute to the recovery of the North American wolverine in the lower
11	forty-eight states;
12	(j) Restoring native species to the state plays an important part in
13	protecting and enhancing biodiversity; and
14	(k) Reintroduction of a species requires authorization by the
15	general assembly pursuant to section 33-2-105.5 (2), Colorado Revised
16	Statutes.
17	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 33-2-105.9 as
18	follows:
19	33-2-105.9. Reintroduction of the North American wolverine
20	- requirements - compensation to owners of livestock - reports - rules
21	- definitions - legislative declaration. (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION,
22	UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:
23	(a) "FEDERAL ACT" MEANS THE FEDERAL "ENDANGERED SPECIES
24	ACT OF 1973", 16 U.S.C. SEC. 1531 ET SEQ., AS AMENDED.
25	(b) "NORTH AMERICAN WOLVERINE" MEANS THE SPECIES GULO
26	GULO LUSCUS.
27	(2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION, THE GENERAL

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1	ASSEMBLY AUTHORIZES THE DIVISION TO REINTRODUCE THE NORTH
2	AMERICAN WOLVERINE IN THE STATE.
3	(3) AS LONG AS THE NORTH AMERICAN WOLVERINE REMAINS ON
4	THE LIST OF THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES PURSUANT TO THE
5	FEDERAL ACT, THE DIVISION SHALL NOT REINTRODUCE THE NORTH
6	AMERICAN WOLVERINE IN THE STATE UNTIL THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF A
7	FINAL RULE DESIGNATING THE NORTH AMERICAN WOLVERINE IN
8	COLORADO AS A NONESSENTIAL EXPERIMENTAL POPULATION PURSUANT
9	to 16 U.S.C. sec. 1539 (j), as published in the federal register by
10	THE UNITED STATES FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE.
11	(4) In conducting the reintroduction of the North
12	AMERICAN WOLVERINE IN THE STATE, THE DIVISION SHALL:
13	(a) COMPLY WITH:
14	(I) THE FINAL RULE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS
15	SECTION;
16	(II) THE APPROACH DESCRIBED IN A NORTH AMERICAN
17	WOLVERINE RESTORATION PLAN DEVELOPED BY THE DIVISION; AND
18	(III) ALL APPLICABLE FEDERAL LAWS, INCLUDING, IF APPLICABLE,
19	THE FEDERAL "NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT OF 1969", 42
20	U.S.C. SEC. 4321 ET SEQ., AS AMENDED; AND
21	(b) Work cooperatively with federal land management
22	AGENCIES THAT HAVE JURISDICTION OVER FEDERAL PUBLIC LANDS WHERE
23	NORTH AMERICAN WOLVERINES MAY BE RELEASED IN COLORADO.
24	(5) In the event that the division develops a North
25	AMERICAN WOLVERINE RESTORATION PLAN PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION
26	$(4)(a)(II) \ \text{of this section, and before the division reintroduces the} \\$
27	NORTH AMERICAN WOLVERINE IN THE STATE, THE COMMISSION SHALL

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1	ADOPT RULES PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT OF FAIR COMPENSATION TO
2	OWNERS OF LIVESTOCK FOR LOSSES OF LIVESTOCK CAUSED BY THE NORTH
3	AMERICAN WOLVERINE PURSUANT TO THE CLAIM PROCEDURES DESCRIBED
4	IN SECTIONS 33-3-107 TO 33-3-110.
5	(6) (a) Before the reintroduction of the North American
6	WOLVERINE IN THE STATE OCCURS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PREPARE A
7	REPORT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33-2-105.7 (2). THE DEPARTMENT
8	SHALL DELIVER THE REPORT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33-2-105.7
9	(3).
10	(b) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PREPARE A REPORT IN ACCORDANCE
11	WITH SECTION 33-2-105.7 (4) FOR EACH OF THE FIVE YEARS AFTER THE
12	REINTRODUCTION OF THE NORTH AMERICAN WOLVERINE OCCURS.
13	NOTWITHSTANDING THE REQUIREMENT IN SECTION 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I),
14	THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DELIVER THE REPORT IN ACCORDANCE WITH
15	SECTION 33-2-105.7 (3).
16	(7) The division may compensate owners of livestock
17	PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS SECTION FROM THE WILDLIFE CASH
18	FUND CREATED IN SECTION 33-1-112 (1); EXCEPT THAT THE DIVISION
19	SHALL NOT USE MONEY WITHIN THE WILDLIFE CASH FUND THAT IS
20	GENERATED FROM THE SALE OF HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSES OR FROM
21	ASSOCIATED FEDERAL GRANTS TO IMPLEMENT THIS SUBSECTION (7).
22	(8) The general assembly deems the recommended
23	EXPENDITURE DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION (8) TO BE IN THE INTEREST
24	OF THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE. PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-33-111 (3), THE
25	EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR IS AUTHORIZED TO OBLIGATE AND EXPEND SEVEN
26	HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE SPECIES CONSERVATION
27	TRUST FUND CREATED IN SECTION 24-33-111 (2)(a) FOR THE PURPOSES OF

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1	IMPLEMENTING AND ADMINISTERING THIS SECTION, EXCEPT AS SET FORTH
2	IN SUBSECTION (7) OF THIS SECTION. THE MONEY DESCRIBED IN THIS
3	SUBSECTION (8) IS AVAILABLE IN STATE FISCAL YEAR 2024-25 AND
4	REMAINS AVAILABLE FOR THE AUTHORIZED PURPOSES UNTIL THE MONEY
5	IS FULLY EXPENDED.
6	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
7	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
8	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
9	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
10	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
11	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
12	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
13	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
14	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
