101	CONCERNING AUTHORIZATION FOR A COUNTY TO SUBMIT A BALLOT
102	QUESTION FOR A COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS TAX
103	AT A BIENNIAL COUNTY OR NOVEMBER ODD-YEAR ELECTION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law authorizes a county to propose a county public safety improvements tax by submitting a ballot question to the voters of the county at a general election only. The bill authorizes a county to also submit such a ballot question at a biennial county election or an election held in November of an odd-numbered year.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 30-11-107.9, amend
3	(3) as follows:
4	30-11-107.9. County tax for public safety improvements -
5	definitions. (3) The board of county commissioners of a county may by
6	resolution approve a proposal for a county public safety improvements
7	tax; thereupon the public safety improvements tax proposal <u>shall MUST</u> be
8	submitted to the registered electors of the county at the next general
9	election, THE NEXT BIENNIAL COUNTY ELECTION, OR THE NEXT ELECTION
10	HELD ON THE FIRST TUESDAY OF NOVEMBER IN AN ODD-NUMBERED YEAR
11	AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. The proposal
12	shall contain a description of the tax including its purposes and shall state
13	the amount to be imposed. The proposal may include a provision to also
14	seek voter approval to retain and expend all or a portion of the revenues
15	of the tax from district fiscal year spending for purposes of section 20 of
16	article X of the state constitution. The conduct of the election shall
17	conform so far as practicable to the general election laws of the state and
18	with the provisions of said section 20.
19	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
20	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
21	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
