<sup>\*</sup> Table 1 shows the new impacts resulting from changes to the program under the bill, and the continuing impacts from extending the program beyond its current repeal date. Because the bill continues a program without making any changes, there are no new impacts. The continuing program impacts will end if the bill is not passed and the program is allowed to repeal.

#### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill continues the registration and reporting requirements of professional review committees under the Colorado Medical Board and the State Board of Nursing until September 1, 2030. Both boards are in the Division of Professions and Occupations (DPO) in the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA). The bill implements the following recommendations from the sunset review:

- clarifies the reporting of governing board data to DPO;
- requires governing boards to annually update their information with DPO; and
- requires DPO to promulgate rules regarding the information a governing board is required to report and establishes a process to remove governing boards from the registry.

## **Background**

Professional review committees review and evaluate the professional conduct and the appropriateness and quality of care by physicians, physician assistants, or advanced practice nurses. These committees' governing boards are registered with DPO and operate at health-care facilities or other entities.

#### **Continuing Program Impacts**

Based on the department's FY 2019-20 budget request, DORA is expected to have expenditures of \$30,772 to administer professional review committee registration and reporting within the Colorado Medical Board and the State Board of Nursing. No fees are assessed on registrant professional review committees. If this bill is enacted, current expenditures will continue for the program starting in FY 2020-21. If this bill is <u>not</u> enacted, the program will end on September 1, 2020, following a wind-down period, and state revenue and expenditures will decrease starting in FY 2020-21 by the amounts shown in Table 1.

#### **State Expenditures**

The changes in the bill may result in a minimal increase in workload for the DPO to conduct rulemaking, outreach, and education. This increase can be accomplished within existing resources.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect August 2, 2019, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 3, 2019, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed. Sections 6 and 7 only take effect if House Bill 19-1172 becomes law, in which case those sections take effect October 1, 2019.
