A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE EPIC (EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICES IMPLEMENTATION FOR CAPACITY) ADVISORY BOARD,

AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATION IN THE 2022 SUNSET REPORT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES TO REPEAL THE ADVISORY BOARD.

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - Senate Judiciary Committee. The bill

implements the recommendation of the department of regulatory agencies, as specified in the department's 2022 sunset review of the EPIC (evidence-based practices implementation for capacity) advisory board, to sunset the advisory board.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-514, amend
3	(4); and repeal (2) as follows:
4	24-33.5-514. Evidence-based practices implementation for
5	capacity program - EPIC fund - creation - repeal. (2) (a) There is
6	hereby created in the division the EPIC advisory board, referred to in this
7	section as the "board".
8	(b) The board shall exercise its powers and perform its duties and
9	functions under the department of public safety.
10	(c) (I) The board shall consist of, at a minimum, the following five
11	members:
12	(A) The executive director of the department of public safety or
13	his or her designee;
14	(B) The executive director of the department of corrections or his
15	or her designee;
16	(C) The executive director of the department of human services
17	or his or her designee;
18	(D) The director of the division of criminal justice in the
19	department of public safety; and
20	(E) The director of the division of probation services in the
21	judicial department or his or her designee.
22	(II) The director of the division of criminal justice may appoint
23	additional members to ensure adequate representation and oversight.

1	(d) The members of the board shall serve without compensation
2	and without reimbursement for expenses.
3	(e) The board shall meet at least four times per calendar year. The
4	director of the division of criminal justice may call such additional
5	meetings as may be necessary for the board to complete its duties.
6	(f) The board shall support the center to create and maintain
7	internal, sustainable structural implementation components of
8	evidence-based practices.
9	(g) The department shall provide office space, equipment, and
10	staff services as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this
11	section.
12	(h) (I) This subsection (2) is repealed, effective September 1,
13	2023.
14	(II) Prior to said repeal, the board shall be reviewed as provided
15	for in section 2-3-1203, C.R.S.
16	(4) By July 1, 2014, and July 1 every three years thereafter, the
17	division shall provide a report to the members of the general assembly
18	regarding the status of the center. The report must include quantitative
19	measures identified by the advisory board that describe the center's
20	impact.
21	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, repeal
22	(14)(a)(II) as follows:
23	2-3-1203. Sunset review of advisory committees - legislative
24	declaration - definition - repeal. (14) (a) The following statutory
25	authorizations for the designated advisory committees are scheduled for
26	repeal on September 1, 2023:
27	(II) The EPIC advisory board created in section 24-33.5-514 (2),

2	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
3	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
4	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
5	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
6	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
7	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
8	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
9	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
10	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
