The Senate Appropriations Committee Report (04/08/22), adopted by the Senate on second reading (04/08/22), added an appropriations clause to the bill that is consistent with the fiscal note.

#### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill includes a clause that appropriates a total of \$77,780 cash funds from the Waste Tire Administration, Enforcement, Market Development, and Cleanup Cash Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2022-23. This entire amount is then reappropriated to the Department of Public Safety (DPS), which is based on the assumption that DPS will require an additional 0.5 FTE. Of this reappropriated amount to the Department of Public Safety, \$9,667 is further reappropriated for fleet vehicles. However, the existing clause contains a technical error that indicates that the Department of Law will provide the fleet vehicles (rather than the Department of

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Personnel).

## **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.002** Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to change the existing clause to correctly identify that the Department of Personnel will provide the fleet vehicles to the Department of Public Safety.
