Bill Summary

A BILL FOR AN ACT

The bill requires the Colorado department of labor and employment (department) to create the Colorado state apprenticeship resource directory. The department is required to collect detailed information on each apprenticeship program in the state, including the application process, requirements for enrollment, costs, and program outcomes. 23	(b) NOTIFYING WORK FORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARDS, AS DEFINED

- (c) Identifying and informing the appropriate contact

 persons at Colorado educational institutions of the

 availability of the directory. The educational institutions

 include high school guidance offices, community colleges, state

 colleges and universities, and private higher education

 institutions.
 - (d) Informing relevant private industry and business associations of the availability of the directory and requesting that the associations promote the directory to association members.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3, 2019); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
