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Summary of Legislation

The bill modifies the section in statute on local government utility relocation arrangements by moving the definition of "utility company betterment" and clarifying its applicability to the entire section.

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Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill updates statutes on local governments to clarify language introduced in <u>House Bill 24-1266</u>. This results in no change to state or local government revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 16, 2025, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
