Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The transparency online project is a free, searchable, web-based system that provides public access to information about state and county revenue and expenditures. Currently, the web-based system does not

always include the name of the vendor paid in connection with an expenditure. The bill requires the web-based system to include the name of the vendor paid in connection with each expenditure included in the system.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-72.4-103, amend 2 3 (1)(i) and (1)(k); and add (1)(l) as follows: 4 24-72.4-103. Web-based system - enhancements - procedure 5 for challenging exclusions. (1) The chief information officer shall 6 modify the web-based system to meet the following requirements: 7 The web-based system shall include a link to the online 8 database; and 9 (k) The web-based system shall include county expenditure and 10 revenue data in accordance with section 24-72.4-106; AND 11 (1) THE WEB-BASED SYSTEM MUST INCLUDE, FOR ANY 12 EXPENDITURE MADE TO PAY A VENDOR, THE LEGAL NAME OF THE VENDOR 13 PAID. THE LEGAL NAME OF THE VENDOR MUST BE INCLUDED WITHOUT 14 REDACTION. 15 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 16 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 17 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 18 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 19 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 20 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 21 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 22 November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 23 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
