#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A MISSING AND MURDERED 102 INDIGENOUS RELATIVES LICENSE PLATE.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <a href="http://leg.colorado.gov">http://leg.colorado.gov</a>.)

The bill creates the missing and murdered Indigenous relatives license plate. An applicant becomes eligible to use the license plate by providing a certificate to the department of revenue confirming that the applicant has made a minimum donation of \$25 to the office of liaison for missing and murdered Indigenous relatives.

In addition to the normal fees for a license plate, a person must pay

an additional one-time fee in the amount of \$25, which money is credited to the highway users tax fund.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 42-3-272 as 3 follows: 4 42-3-272. Special plates - missing and murdered Indigenous 5 relatives - legislative declaration - definitions. (1) THE GENERAL 6 ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES THAT: 7 (a) INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES IN COLORADO, INCLUDING THE 8 SOUTHERN UTE INDIAN AND UTE MOUNTAIN UTE RESERVATIONS, AND 9 ACROSS THE UNITED STATES HAVE BEEN DISPROPORTIONATELY IMPACTED 10 BY THE CRISIS OF MISSING AND MURDERED INDIGENOUS PEOPLE. THIS 11 CRISIS HAS AFFECTED THE SAFETY, WELL-BEING, AND CULTURAL FABRIC 12 OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES AND CONTINUES TO DEMAND URGENT ATTENTION 13 AND ACTION. 14 (b) THERE IS SIGNIFICANT UNDERREPORTING OF CASES INVOLVING 15 MISSING AND MURDERED INDIGENOUS RELATIVES, AND THE ABSENCE OF 16 SPECIALIZED RESOURCES AND SERVICES TO ADDRESS THESE CASES 17 CONTRIBUTES TO THE ONGOING VIOLENCE AND NEGLECT FACED BY 18 INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES. FAMILIES AND TRIBAL NATIONS OFTEN FACE 19 SYSTEMIC BARRIERS IN OBTAINING JUSTICE, SERVICES, AND RESOURCES TO 20 ASSIST IN THE SEARCH FOR AND RECOVERY OF THEIR LOVED ONES. 21 (c) ADEQUATE FUNDING IS ESSENTIAL TO SUPPORT THE OFFICE OF 22 LIAISON FOR MISSING AND MURDERED INDIGENOUS RELATIVES AND TO 23 STRENGTHEN INITIATIVES AIMED AT PROVIDING RESOURCES FOR AFFECTED 24 FAMILIES, IMPROVING INVESTIGATION PROTOCOLS, FACILITATING 25 COMMUNICATION BETWEEN LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, AND RAISING
