A BILL FOR AN ACT
CONCERNING A TRANSFER OF MONEY FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO
CASH FUNDS ADMINISTERED BY STATE DEPARTMENTS FOR THE

Bill Summary

PROTECTION OF THE STATE'S NATURAL RESOURCES.

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. On July 1, 2017, the bill requires the state treasurer to transfer money from the general fund as follows:

- ! \$2,272,727 million to the forest restoration and wildfire risk mitigation grant program cash fund;
- ! \$4,090,909 million to the species conservation trust fund;

- ! \$2,452,193 million to the division of parks and outdoor recreation aquatic nuisance species fund; and
- ! \$1,184,171 million to the division of wildlife aquatic nuisance species fund.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-31-310, amend 3 as amended by Senate Bill 17-050 (8.5)(a)(I); and add (8.7) as follows: 4 23-31-310. Forest restoration and wildfire risk mitigation 5 grant program - legislative declaration - definitions - technical 6 advisory panel - repeal. (8.5) Forest restoration and wildfire risk 7 mitigation grant program cash fund. (a) There is hereby created in the 8 state treasury the forest restoration and wildfire risk mitigation grant 9 program cash fund. The department of higher education shall administer 10 the fund, which consists of: 11 (I) All money transferred by the treasurer as specified in section 12 39-29-109.3 (2)(k) AND SUBSECTION (8.7) OF THIS SECTION; and 13 (8.7) ON JULY 1, 2017, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER 14 TWO MILLION TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED 15 TWENTY-SEVEN DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE FOREST 16 RESTORATION AND WILDFIRE RISK MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM CASH 17 FUND. 18 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33-111, amend 19 (2)(a)(I) as follows: 20 24-33-111. Conservation of native species - fund created. 21 (2) Species conservation trust fund - creation. (a) (I) (A) There is 22 hereby created in the state treasury the species conservation trust fund, 23 which is subject to annual authorization by the general assembly to carry

out the purposes of this section. The state treasurer shall transfer all revenues previously allocated to the operation and maintenance account and the capital account, as such accounts existed before June 8, 2012, to the fund. The fund consists of all money transferred by the TREASURER AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 39-29-109.3 (2)(e) AND SUBSECTION (2)(a)(I)(B) OF THIS SECTION. All income derived from the deposit and investment of moneys MONEY in the fund shall be IS credited to the fund. At the end of any fiscal year, all unexpended moneys MONEY in the fund remain REMAINS in the fund and shall not be credited or transferred to the general fund or any other fund. To the maximum extent practical, only interest from the fund shall be expended for activities pursuant to this section. (B) ON JULY 1, 2017, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER

(B) ON JULY 1, 2017, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER FOUR MILLION NINETY THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED NINE DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE SPECIES CONSERVATION TRUST FUND.

SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-10.5-108, **amend** (1)(a) and (2)(a); and **add** (1.5) as follows:

33-10.5-108. Division of parks and outdoor recreation aquatic nuisance species fund - creation - division of wildlife aquatic nuisance species fund - creation. (1) (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the division of parks and outdoor recreation aquatic nuisance species fund, which shall be administered by the division of parks and wildlife in the department of natural resources and shall consist CONSISTS of all moneys MONEY transferred by the treasurer as specified in section 39-29-109.3 (2)(m) C.R.S. AND SUBSECTION (1.5)(a) OF THIS SECTION. All moneys MONEY in the fund are IS continuously appropriated to the division of parks and wildlife for the purpose of implementing the

determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate

preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
