# **Bill Summary**

Sentencing in the Criminal Justice System Interim Study Committee. The bill directs the Colorado commission on criminal and juvenile justice (commission) to contract for a study of the most effective criminal sentencing practices available. The commission must establish an advisory committee to review the study and make recommendations

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 16-11.3-103, add 3 (2.6) as follows: 4 16-11.3-103. Duties of the commission - mission - staffing -5 repeal. (2.6) (a) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONTRACT FOR A STUDY BASED 6 ON EMPIRICAL ANALYSIS AND EVIDENCE-BASED DATA THAT IDENTIFIES 7 THE MOST EFFECTIVE CRIMINAL SENTENCING PRACTICES AVAILABLE. THE 8 STUDY MUST BE COMPLETED BY JULY 1, 2019. 9 (b) THE COMMISSION SHALL \_\_\_ REVIEW THE STUDY'S OUTCOME 10 AND, BASED ON THE REVIEW OF THE STUDY, MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS \_\_\_ 11 FOR CRIMINAL SENTENCING CHANGES IN COLORADO. 12 (c) This subsection (2.6) is repealed, effective July 1, 2020. 13 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 14 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 15 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 16 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 17 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 18 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 19 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 20 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 21 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 22 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
