BILL TOPIC: LIMITED WINERY DIRECT DELIVERY PERSONAL CONSUMERS

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, a limited winery licensee with a winery direct shipper's permit may only use a common carrier to deliver the wine it manufactures to personal consumers within Colorado. The bill allows a limited winery licensee to also deliver the wine it manufactures directly to personal consumers without the use of a common carrier, as long as the licensee also has a winery direct shipper's permit and follows the requirements of the permit.

Assessment

The bill only impacts the operations of a limited winery licensee and does not impact the revenue or expenditures of any state agency or local government. For this reason, it is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 21, 2016 and takes effect on August 10, 2016, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
