**Fiscal note status:** The final fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Health and Human Services Committee on August 21, 2025; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

## **Summary Information**

**Overview.** The bill would have required state agencies to provide guidance to health care providers and facilities on prioritizing the continuity of care for disproportionately impacted communities.

**Types of impacts.** The bill was projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

## **Summary of Legislation**

By December 15, 2025, the bill requires the Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) and the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) to issue guidance to health care providers and facilities that are ineligible for federal Medicaid funding under new federal budget laws. The guidance must explain how providers and facilities can prioritize the continuity of care for disproportionately impacted communities, including communities of color, rural communities, and low-income populations. Health care providers and facilities are encouraged to follow the guidance.

## **State Expenditures**

Workload for CDPHE and HCPF will minimally increase to create and issue guidance for providers and facilities in FY 2025-26. This workload can be accomplished within existing resources.

## **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
