SENATE RESOLUTION 18-005
CONCERNING THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND
ENVIRONMENT'S PROPOSED RULES REGULATING THE ASSISTED
LIVING INDUSTRY IN COLORADO.
WHEREAS, The number of older adults in Colorado is increasing
rapidly, and the population of adults in Colorado over the age of 60 will
increase 88% between 2018 and 2050; and
WHEREAS, Some older adults are not able to live independently
in their homes and must rely on assisted living residences for care; and
WHEREAS, The Colorado Department of Public Health and
Environment (CDPHE) is the regulatory agency charged with the
regulation and oversight of assisted living residences in Colorado; and

1	WHEREAS, The number of assisted living residences that are
2	licensed in the state is increasing exponentially, and is currently at 660,
3	with 60% serving 20 residents or fewer; and
4	WHEREAS, It is the duty of the state of Colorado to ensure that
5	these facilities are able to safely care for older and vulnerable adults; and
	
6	WHEREAS, Assisted living residents in Colorado are older,
7	frailer, and have more complex health care needs than 30 years ago, with
8	57% of assisted living residents being over the age of 85 and 43% having
9	Alzheimer's disease or some other form of dementia; and
,	Aizhenner's disease of some other form of dementia, and
10	WHEDEAS The Engility Childelines Institute's suidelines
10	WHEREAS, The Facility Guidelines Institute's guidelines
11	discourage renovations and new construction of small assisted living
12	residences; and
13	WHEREAS, The federal government provides funding to ensure
14	that Colorado's 228 nursing homes, in which residents require
15	around-the-clock care, are regularly surveyed for safety, and the CDPHE
16	has 46 inspectors to do this job; and
17	WHEREAS, The CDPHE does not receive state general funds to
18	ensure appropriate oversight of assisted living residences in our state; and
19	WHEREAS, Safety inspections for assisted living residences are
20	paid for by the facilities themselves through licensure fees, resulting in
21	only 12 state inspectors to ensure that our 660 assisted living residences
22	are safe; and
23	WHEREAS, The CDPHE and industry stakeholders have, over the
24	last 24 months, developed a proposed set of rules to regulate assisted
25	living residences in Colorado; and
26	WHEREAS, Stakeholders had opportunities to provide input and
27	modify these rules, which are going before the Colorado Board of Health
28	(Board) for final approval on April 18, 2018; and

29	WHEREAS, The CDPHE modified rules in response to the
30	concerns of smaller facilities during this process; and

2 1	WHEDEAS The majority of these assisted living residences some
31	WHEREAS, The majority of these assisted living residences serve
32	the Medicaid population of the state; and

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1	WHEREAS, Assisted living residences will receive a 25%
2	Medicaid rate increase in the 2018-19 state budget, resulting in a \$4,700
3	per year per resident increase; and
4	WHEREAS, The proposed rules are intended to ensure the health
5	and safety of the older adults reliant on assisted living residences for care,
6	and they regulate administrator competency, staff training, safety
7	measures, and food preparation; now, therefore,
8	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly
9	of the State of Colorado:
10	That we, the members of the Colorado Senate, request that:
11	(1) The CDPHE and the Colorado Board of Health (Board) delay
12	implementation and enforcement of the rules for small assisted living
13	residences with fewer than 20 beds for an additional six months;
14	(2) Beginning May 15, 2018, the CDPHE and the Board continue
15	to work with stakeholders to ensure that the rules are modified as
16	appropriate for small assisted living residences; and
17	(3) The Joint Budget Committee work with the CDPHE to ensure
18	that adequate funding is provided to protect older Coloradans who rely on
19	assisted living residences for care.
20	Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of this Resolution be
21	transmitted to Colorado Governor John Hickenlooper; Dr. Larry Wolk,
22	Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Public Health and
23	Environment; the Colorado Board of Health; Randy Kuykendall, Director
24	of the Health Facilities and Emergency Medical Services Division of the
25	Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment; and the
26	members of the Colorado Board of Health.

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
