A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING ESTABLISHING A PILOT PROGRAM TO REDUCE THE SUICIDE RATE AMONG VETERANS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires the state department of human services (department) to establish a veteran suicide prevention pilot program (pilot program) to reduce the suicide rate and suicidal ideation among veterans by providing no-cost, stigma-free, confidential, and effective behavioral health treatment for post-9/11 veterans and their families. The department is permitted to enter into an agreement with a nonprofit organization to

administer the pilot program. The department is required to include information about the pilot program in its annual report to the general assembly. The pilot program is repealed June 30, 2025.

14	STIGMA-FREE, CONFIDENTIAL, AND EFFECTIVE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH
15	TREATMENT FOR VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES.
16	(b) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH THE PILOT

13	TREATMENT PROVIDERS IN THE PILOT PROGRAM AREA TO PROVIDE THE
14	SERVICES DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTIONS (3)(a)(II) AND (3)(a)(III) OF THIS
15	SECTION.
16	(4) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT RULES NECESSARY FOR
17	THE ADMINISTRATION OF THIS SECTION.
18	(5) The state department may enter into an agreement
19	WITH A NONPROFIT <u>OR EDUCATIONAL</u> ORGANIZATION TO ADMINISTER THE
20	PILOT PROGRAM. THE NONPROFIT <u>OR EDUCATIONAL</u> ORGANIZATION MUST
21	HAVE AT LEAST <u>FIVE</u> YEARS' EXPERIENCE PROVIDING SERVICES DESCRIBED
22	IN THIS SECTION TO <u>VETERANS AND SATISFY ANY ADDITIONAL</u>
23	QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT. THE STATE
24	DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT RULES TO ESTABLISH ADDITIONAL
25	QUALIFICATIONS FOR A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION TO ENSURE EFFICIENT
26	AND EFFECTIVE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM AND A PROCESS
27	FOR SELECTING A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION TO ADMINISTER THE PILOT

(6) IN ITS ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMITTEES OF REFERENCE
PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-7-203, THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL INCLUDE
INFORMATION CONCERNING THE PILOT PROGRAM AND WHETHER ANY
CHANGES SHOULD BE MADE TO THE PILOT PROGRAM THAT WOULD
INCREASE ITS EFFECTIVENESS. IN ITS FINAL REPORT PRIOR TO THE REPEAL
OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL INCLUDE A RECOMMENDATION
OF WHETHER THE PILOT PROGRAM SHOULD BE CONTINUED.

(7) This section is repealed, effective June 30, 2025.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
