SENATE MEMORIAL 18-001
MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS TO ACTIVELY PURSUE THE RETURN OF
THE U.S.S. PUEBLO FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF THE
DEMOCRATIC PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF KOREA.
WHEREAS, Recent actions by the Democratic People's Republic
of Korea, or North Korea, suggest that the nation and South Korea have
entered into a new phase of their relationship, marked by optimism,
respect, and hope for a more cooperative future; and
WHEREAS, While the Declaration of War between the two
nations has not yet been rescinded, the recent meeting between the
nations' leadersjust the second such meeting since 1948has resulted in
some detente between the North and South, including a promise by North
Korea to end its nuclear program in the coming weeks; and
WHEREAS, The state of Colorado has a unique relationship with
North Korea: In 1966, the U.S.S. Pueblo was named in honor of the city

and county of Pueblo, Colorado; the ship was attacked by the North

Korean military in international waters on January 23, 1968, and, in the

attack, one crew member was killed and eighty crew members and two

civilian oceanographers were captured and held for eleven months by the

I	North Korean government; and
2 3 4	WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Pueblo is still in commission in the United States Navy but continues to be held by the North Korean government and is currently a museum in Pyongyang, North Korea; and
5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, The United States government is encouraged and hopeful for continued positive developments on the Korean peninsula, as evidenced by Secretary of State Mike Pompeo's recent meeting with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un and President Donald Trump's planned diplomatic trip to the Demilitarized Zone; now, therefore,
10 11	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
12	That we, the Senate of the State of Colorado:
13 14 15	(1) Applaud and support the recent peaceful actions of North Korea and are hopeful that the nation will continue on a positive course for the benefit of its citizens and for the cause of global security;
16 17 18	(2) Believe that the return of the U.S.S. Pueblo to the people of Colorado and the United States would be a remarkable, good faith action by North Korea in this time of conversation and healing; and
19 20 21	(3) Strongly urge Congress, alongside President Donald Trump and his cabinet, to actively pursue the return of the U.S.S. Pueblo to its rightful home.
22 23 24 25	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Memorial be sent to President Donald Trump; Mike Pompeo, Secretary of State; Marc Knapper, Charge d'Affaires ad interim to South Korea; and Colorado's Congressional delegation.
