A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT THAT AN INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURE

COMMITTEE CREATED BY A CANDIDATE FOR PUBLIC OFFICE IS

SUBJECT TO CONSTITUTIONAL REQUIREMENTS GOVERNING

LIMITS ON CONTRIBUTIONS TO SUCH CANDIDATES.

### **Bill Summary**

For purposes of the "Fair Campaign Practices Act", an independent expenditure committee is one or more persons that make an independent expenditure in excess of \$1,000 or that collect in excess of \$1,000 for the

purpose of making an independent expenditure. An independent expenditure is an expenditure that is not controlled by or coordinated with any candidate or agent of such candidate.

Under the bill, any independent expenditure committee established, financed, or maintained by a candidate or candidate committee in accordance with the decision of the Colorado court of appeals in the case of *Colorado Republican Party v. Williams*, 2016 COA 26 (2016), is subject to the contribution limits and restrictions that are imposed on candidate committees as specified in the state constitution.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 1-45-103.7, amend 3 (2.5) as follows: 4 1-45-103.7. Contribution limits - treatment of independent 5 expenditure committees - contributions from limited liability 6 companies - voter instructions on spending limits - definitions. 7 (2.5) An independent expenditure committee shall not be treated as a 8 political committee and, therefore, shall not be subject to the requirements 9 of section 3 (5) of article XXVIII of the state constitution. ANY 10 INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURE COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED, FINANCED, OR 11 MAINTAINED BY A CANDIDATE OR CANDIDATE COMMITTEE IN 12 ACCORDANCE WITH THE DECISION OF THE COLORADO COURT OF APPEALS 13 IN THE CASE OF COLORADO REPUBLICAN PARTY V. WILLIAMS, 2016 COA 26 14 (2016), IS SUBJECT TO THE CONTRIBUTION LIMITS AND ANY OTHER 15 RESTRICTIONS THAT ARE IMPOSED ON CANDIDATE COMMITTEES AS 16 SPECIFIED IN SECTION 3 OF ARTICLE XXVIII OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION. 17 **SECTION 2.** Applicability. This act applies to the portion of any 18 election cycle or for the portion of the calendar year remaining after the 19 effective date of this act and for any election cycle or calendar year 20 commencing after such effective date, whichever is applicable.
