Summary Information

Overview. The bill allows the use of the most recent or a prior version of the National Geodetic Survey's state plane coordinate system.

No fiscal impact. The bill has no fiscal impact on state or local government.

Summary of Legislation

The bill allows the use of either the most recent version, or a prior version, of the National Geodetic Survey's state plane coordinate system to state geographic positions or locations within Colorado. The bill does not prohibit use of the Colorado coordinate system of 1927 or 1983.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill updates statute to allow land managers to use modern versions of the state plane coordinate system. The bill does not change how state and local land managers, such as the State Land Board, use coordinate systems for land measurement or demarcation. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 14, 2025 and took effect on August 6, 2025.
