A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE ELIMINATION OF "REGISTERED" IN THE TITLE OF A
102 NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law requires a naturopathic doctor to use the term "registered" in the doctor's title. The bill changes the titles that naturopathic doctors may use by eliminating the word "registered".

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
2	hereby finds and declares that:
3	(a) The purpose of this act is to protect the public's health, safety,
4	and welfare with respect to the practice of naturopathic doctors; and
5	(b) The term "registered" should be removed from the title of
6	naturopathic doctor in order to eliminate confusion for the public, to
7	distinguish a naturopathic doctor from other professions, and to protect
8	the public from any persons who might falsely hold themselves out as
9	naturopathic doctors.
10	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-37.3-110, amend
11	(2) as follows:
12	12-37.3-110. Persons entitled to practice as naturopathic
13	doctors - title protection for naturopathic doctors. (2) A naturopathic
14	doctor may use the title "registered" naturopathic doctor", or "registered"
15	"doctor of naturopathy", or the initials "R.N.D." "N.D."
16	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
17	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
18	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
