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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101      **CONCERNING AUTHORIZATION FOR THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO**  
102              **APPROVE THE PLACEMENT OF NONPARTISAN LEGISLATIVE**  
103              **FELLOWSHIPS WITHIN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STAFF.**

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**Bill Summary**

The bill authorizes the legislative council to approve agreements between the director of research of the legislative council and nonpartisan organizations to place nonpartisan legislative policy fellows (fellows) in the legislative council staff. The bill also specifies the types of work that fellows may do, requires the director of research to retain supervisory

authority over fellows, including over the terms and conditions of the fellowship, and requires any work product produced by a fellow during the fellowship to remain the property of the general assembly during and after the conclusion of the fellowship.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-303, **amend** (1)  
3 introductory portion; and **add** (1)(h) as follows:

4 **2-3-303. Functions - report - definitions - repeal.** (1) In  
5 addition to any other powers and duties set forth in law, the council ~~shall~~  
6 ~~have~~ HAS the following powers and duties:

7 (h) TO APPROVE AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE DIRECTOR OF  
8 RESEARCH OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND NONPARTISAN  
9 ORGANIZATIONS TO PLACE NONPARTISAN LEGISLATIVE POLICY FELLOWS  
10 IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STAFF TO CONDUCT POLICY-RELATED  
11 RESEARCH; PREPARE POLICY, FISCAL, ECONOMIC, OR TECHNOLOGICAL  
12 ANALYSES; SUPPORT LEGISLATORS AND COMMITTEES; AND COMPLETE  
13 OTHER ASSIGNMENTS OR PROJECTS AS DIRECTED BY THE DIRECTOR OF  
14 RESEARCH. AN AGREEMENT ENTERED INTO BY THE DIRECTOR OF  
15 RESEARCH AND APPROVED BY THE COUNCIL PURSUANT TO THIS  
16 SUBSECTION (1)(h) MUST ENSURE THAT THE DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH  
17 RETAINS SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY OVER FELLOWS PLACED WITHIN THE  
18 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STAFF, INCLUDING OVER THE TERMS AND  
19 CONDITIONS OF THE FELLOWSHIP. AN AGREEMENT MUST ALSO SPECIFY  
20 THAT ANY WORK PRODUCT PRODUCED BY A FELLOW DURING THE  
21 FELLOWSHIP REMAINS THE PROPERTY OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DURING  
22 AND AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE FELLOWSHIP.

23 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act

1 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
2 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except  
3 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V  
4 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this  
5 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take  
6 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
7 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
8 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
