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# **Summary of Legislation**

The bill eliminates an obsolete task force in the Department of Labor and Employment that provided recommendations on the administration and establishment of the Paid Family and Medical Leave (FAMLI) program.

## **Assessment of No Fiscal Impact**

The task force has been inactive since it submitted its final report in 2020. It has no associated revenue or costs under current law, and the bill strikes obsolete language from state statute. For these reasons, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

## **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
