#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A BAN ON VOTE TRADING.

### **Bill Summary**

The bill makes it a misdemeanor criminal offense for a person to trade a vote or offer to trade a vote with another elector in this state or a person in another state in exchange for the other person's vote for or against a particular candidate, ballot issue, or ballot question.

1	<b>SECTION 1.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 1-13-720, amend (1)
2	introductory portion and (2); and add (1)(d) as follows:
3	1-13-720. Unlawfully giving or promising money or
4	employment or engaging in vote trading. (1) It is unlawful for any
5	person, directly or indirectly, by himself INDIVIDUALLY or through any
6	other person:
7	(d) TO FACILITATE THE TRADING OF VOTES BETWEEN AN ELECTOR
8	IN THE STATE OR A PERSON IN ANOTHER STATE IN EXCHANGE FOR THE
9	OTHER PERSON'S VOTE FOR OR AGAINST A PARTICULAR CANDIDATE,
10	BALLOT ISSUE, OR BALLOT QUESTION. A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION
11	(1)(d) IS A CLASS 2 PETTY OFFENSE AND, UPON CONVICTION THEREOF, THE
12	OFFENDER SHALL BE PUNISHED BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN ONE
13	THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE.
14	(2) EXCEPT FOR THE OFFENSE SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION $(1)(d)$ OF
15	THIS SECTION, each offense set forth in subsection (1) of this section is a
16	misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, the offender shall be
17	punished as provided in section 1-13-111.
18	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date -
19	applicability. (1) This act takes effect September 1, 2018; except that,
20	if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of
21	the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
22	within the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general
23	assembly, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless
24	approved by the people at the general election to be held in November
25	2018 and, in such case, will take effect on January 1, 2019, or on the date
26	of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor, whichever
27	is later.
