A BILL FOR AN ACT
CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE OFFICE OF CARDIAC ARREST
MANAGEMENT IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND
ENVIRONMENT.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill creates the office of cardiac arrest management (office) in the department of public health and environment.

The office is required to:

• Facilitate the registration of defibrillators in this state through the implementation of a statewide registry;

- Coordinate cardiac arrest data, including outcome data from facilities that treat cardiac patients and from coroners;
- Implement an outreach campaign to raise public awareness regarding cardiac arrest;
- Provide training and education programs statewide to teach the skills necessary to save lives; and
- Employ a statewide cardiac arrest data coordinator, a defibrillator registry coordinator, and other personnel as necessary.

The bill requires the general assembly to appropriate \$500,000 annually for use by the office.

1	(a) IMPLEMENT AN OUTREACH CAMPAIGN TO RAISE PUBLIC
2	AWARENESS REGARDING CARDIAC ARREST AND THE SKILLS NECESSARY TO

7	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
8	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this

act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take

effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the

official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
