01	CONCERNING THE AVAILABILITY OF HYPERBARIC OXYGEN THERAPY
02	AS A TREATMENT OPTION FOR RESIDENTS OF THE STATE OF

1 2 3 4 5	WHEREAS, Many residents of the state of Colorado experience Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). These conditions impact active military service members and first responders and veterans of these vocations in large numbers, as well as the general population; and
6 7 8	WHEREAS, It is believed that these conditions contribute to the high rate of suicide, drug addiction, alcoholism, and mental health issues among these vulnerable individuals; and

WHEREAS, Congress enacted the "Commander John Scott Hannon Veterans Mental Health Care Improvement Act of 2019" as a way to "improve mental health care provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes". Congress has mandated that the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) consider making Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) treatment more readily available to VA patients and that the VA conduct a comprehensive study and pilot program and prepare a report on the "efficacy and effectiveness of hyperbaric oxygen therapy for the treatment of post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury"; and

WHEREAS, HBOT has shown potential to be a safe and effective treatment for those experiencing TBI and PTSD, particularly when HBOT is integrated with PTSD counseling. The state of Colorado is home to one of the leading pioneers in this type of treatment; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:

- (1) That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly, find that the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the state of Colorado will benefit from increased awareness and availability of HBOT as a treatment for TBI and PTSD.
- (2) That it should be the aim of the state to provide for its residents all viable options to combat the debilitating effects of TBI and PTSD and improve their quality of life. We therefore strongly support the efforts of Congress to study and review the efficacy of HBOT for treating the serious and life-altering effects of TBI and PTSD.
- (3) That we strongly encourage the medical community in Colorado to become informed about HBOT and the efforts of Congress to actively study this treatment. We also encourage the medical community in Colorado to cooperate and coordinate with each other and with the VA to the extent possible by sharing data and conducting research on this cutting-edge treatment.
- (4) That we affirm our commitment to all residents of Colorado, our active military service members and first responders, and veterans of these vocations in particular to be a national leader in providing comprehensive mental health and medical care options so that they can
