A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES IN LOCAL

GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires local governments, including school districts, with a procurement budget of a certain size to collect data regarding the participation of historically underutilized businesses in local government procurement for a 5-year period and requires the local government to annually report that data to the secretary of state. The bill requires the secretary of state to share summarized data with the department of local

affairs. The bill further requires the department of local affairs to annually include the summarized data received from the secretary of state as part of the department's presentation to its committee of reference at a hearing held pursuant to the "State Measurement for Accountable, Responsive, and Transparent (SMART) Government Act".

The bill defines a historically underutilized business as a business that is at least 51% owned and controlled, in both the management and day-to-day business decisions, by one or more individuals who are:

- Members of a racial or ethnic minority group;
- Non-Hispanic Caucasian women;
- Persons with physical or mental disabilities;
- Members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender community; or
- Veterans.

1 (2) (a) ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 15, 2024, AND ON OR BEFORE 2 EACH NOVEMBER 15 THEREAFTER THROUGH NOVEMBER 15, 2029, THE 3 LOCAL GOVERNMENT SHALL REPORT THE DATA, IN WRITING, TO THE 4 SECRETARY OF STATE. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ANNUALLY SHARE 5 A SUMMARY OF THE DATA RECEIVED FROM LOCAL GOVERNMENTS UNDER 6 SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL 7 AFFAIRS. 8 THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS SHALL ANNUALLY (b) 9 INCLUDE THE SUMMARIZED DATA RECEIVED FROM THE SECRETARY OF 10 STATE AS PART OF THE DEPARTMENT'S PRESENTATION TO ITS COMMITTEE 11 OF REFERENCE AT A HEARING HELD PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-7-203 (2)(a) 12 OF THE "STATE MEASUREMENT FOR ACCOUNTABLE, RESPONSIVE, AND 13 TRANSPARENT (SMART) GOVERNMENT ACT". 14 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 15 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 16 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 17 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 18 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 19 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 20 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 21 November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 22

official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
